

Google Fiber's announcement that it plans to offer high-speed Internet service in several nearby towns raises questions for many people in Holly Springs.

We'd like you to know that the town has moved ahead of the trend by completing construction of its own state-of-the-art fiber optic network backbone last June.

The Town Council and Information Technology staff recognized years ago that advanced network infrastructure would enable us to provide world-class government services, promote economic development, and

evolves over time to meet your needs, too.

Before starting the network, we studied the issue extensively. We verified that it made financial sense to install fiber optics to town government buildings and public safety agencies.

State law currently prohibits us from directly offering broadband service to residents. However, the network was designed so that a private company could do that at some point. There's plenty of spare fiber and underground conduit space that could be leased to serve businesses or homes.

"We look forward to seeing potential investment by a provider in the Holly Springs community in the future," said Jeff Wilson, our Information Technology director.

the right time to go out on a limb

February is prime time to prune your street trees and other plants while they are dormant.

If your neighborhood has street trees, they were originally installed by the builder or developer. If you have trees at the street, we encourage you to prune them for appearance.

To retain clearance for vehicles and also for people on the sidewalk, we suggest having the lowest branches at least 13 feet off the ground. If your tree needs replacing and you are not sure what to replant, call Planning and Zoning at (919) 557-3908 or send an e-mail to hsplanning@hollyspringsnc.us.
