WHEREAS, the Town of Holly Springs takes pride in recognizing February as Black History Month, celebrating the many notable contributions Black people have made to our country and town; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate the diversity of Black people in Holly Springs and the nation, whether they identify as African, African-American, Afro-Latino, Afro-Caribbean, or Black; and

WHEREAS, this year's Black History Month theme of *A Century of Black History Commemorations*, recognizes celebrations stretching back to Dr. Carter G. Woodson's inaugural week-long Black History observance in 1925; and

WHEREAS, February was formally adopted as Black History Month in 1976 by President Gerald Ford;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mike Kondratick, Mayor of the Town of Holly Springs, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim February 2026 as
